A Word from our Pastor

The prophet Daniel was a man greatly used by God. He boldly spoke the Words of God living in and among a pagan Babylonian culture. He was one of the few Old Testament prophets who foretold not only future events surrounding Israel but also the Gentile nations as well. He respectfully but firmly chose to stand on his conviction that we should only bow before the one true God of Israel and as a result was cast into a den of hungry lions. We are all too familiar with the heroic picture of Daniel exiting the lion's den without as much as a scratch on his body. No doubt, as I stated earlier, Daniel was a hero of the faith (Heb. 11:33). However, rather than idolize this man by looking only at his great accomplishments we should ask ourselves where he got his courage and integrity. We would be naïve indeed if we believe he simply woke one day and was a spiritual giant. A cursory study of the Book of Daniel gives us two general insights about his life. First, Daniel loved God and purposed in his heart to keep himself separate from the secular and worldly system of the day (Dan. 1:8). Daniel knew God loved him and wanted to keep himself from anything that would hinder his service to Jehovah. Daniel made a choice early on that God would be first in his life. He recognized that ultimately everything he had came from God (even life itself.) Today the Lord Jesus Christ has called us to make Him our first love (Rev. 2:4). This may require us to end or modify relationships with things and people that compete with Him. Second, Daniel was a man of fervent prayer. On multiple occasions Daniel wrestled with God for answers to the problems of his day. In Daniel 9 we are told the Prophet prayed ceaselessly for 21 straight days before receiving an answer from the Lord. Portions of his prayer are recorded for our learning and we can almost hear Daniel asking God to forgive the sins of the nation and pleading for His divine mercy. We read of His deep love for God and His Word (as it's quoted substantially). We read about the passionate praise he heaps upon His God. Thank God we are given a glimpse of the prayer life of Daniel. Daniel knew where his strength lie and it was not in himself but in God. This month as we emphasize prayer for revival let us remember that God has the power and the desire to renew His people again. As His people we have the privilege of asking Him. Please join me as I intercede for a heaven sent revival at South Burleson. As the Holy Spirit brings these things to remembrance please lift them up. Please set aside special time for prayer and ask God to begin with you. Also please make time to attend our corporate times of prayer listed in our weekly bulletins. Pray...pray...pray!!! I also wanted to give God thanks for a great summer and look forward to a great fall around the church. We have ended our series from the Book of Genesis and will soon begin the study of the Book of I Corinthians. I know God has much to say to us through this relevant letter. To God be the glory!

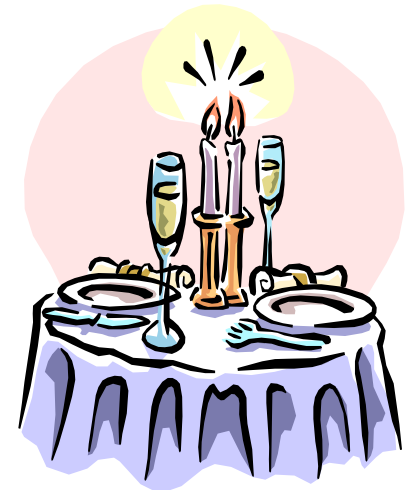
